Butler Square Refresh Complete

The refresh at Butler Square is officially complete! The refresh started in December 2019 and completed in late January 2021.

Our wonderful contractors McGough Construction did a tremendous job completing the refresh done in a timely manner, especially during a pandemic.

What was done:

- Previous conference room in the east atrium transformed into a cozy tenant lounge
 - Includes 2 TV's, games, plenty of resting space, microwave, fridge, and books.
- New conference room built in the west atrium
 - Seats up to 68 people
 - o Video/phone conferencing technologies and wireless capabilities
 - Server bar and area
 - o Refrigerator
 - o 2 restrooms
- New shower rooms next to the bike room
- Installed new faux plants on floors 3-9
- Installed three new planter boxes on the first floor
- New furniture throughout the west and east atrium
- Installed a spiral staircase in place of escalators
- New lighting on the glider
- New LED lighting throughout the first and second floor
- New carpet on the second floor
- Tile installed on the first floor
- New and revamped cafe on the first floor (same owner)
- New security desk near the Ist Ave entrance

Clorox360 Machine

The Clorox360 machine is an electrostatic sprayer that is used as an enhanced coverage for better germ protection. The electrostatic sprayer is used to spray a suite or common area space and kill germs on the spot. This machine is EPA-approved to kill the COVID-19 virus and SARS-CoV-2 on hard surfaces.

This machine is available for use by requesting the service at the management office. There is a small fee on this machine but ready to use at the snap of a finger. This machine is a great way to introduce tenants back into their space and protect and reduce pathogens.

Our trusted and approved ABM cleaners are trained and ready to use the machine at your request. Once used, we request you wait at least I hour before returning to the suite to ensure cleanliness.
